- Free text search terms and operators
- Legal Practice Areas
- Jurisdictions
- Legal Resource Types
- Date restrictions
- Sort options

The response contains a list of relevant Practical Law articles and rich meta-data which also include:

- Legal Practice Areas
- Jurisdictions
- Legal Resource Types

These items could be used to provide filtering and combine with other data sources.

This service is open and requires no authentication. We can provide a detailed specification document to tell you exactly how to make queries and understand the result data, including how to create a link to the documents on Practical Law for each result. It is assumed that the reader understands basic HTTP URL construction and XML data.
